

RIPPING A DVD TO YOUR COMPUTER

In order to upload your game film to Go Big Recruiting, you first need to transfer the game to your computer. Your entire game film will be about 45 minutes in length, so in order to properly upload it to Go Big Recruiting, you need to compress it to a file size that will be acceptable. You are also able to rip your highlight film as well.

To do this, you will need to use a DVD ripping software. We recommend using Handbrake, which can be found at: <http://handbrake.fr/?article=download>

Once you have installed Handbrake, or another application that will allow you to rip your DVD to your computer, please follow the steps below.

STEP 1:

Insert the DVD into your computer's disk drive

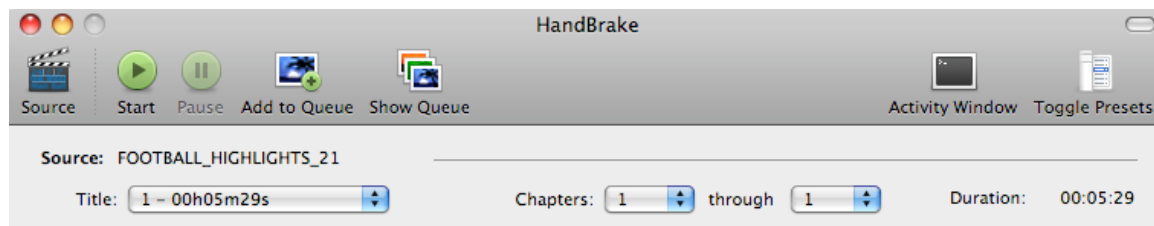
Open Handbrake or your DVD ripping application. The screenshots below are from Handbrake running on an Apple computer. If you are on a PC, the images might be slightly different.

STEP 2:

Once Handbrake opens, select the DVD that you inserted into your computer.

Handbrake will open up the control dashboard. This dashboard will allow you to change the parameters to ensure high quality video that is a compressed size.


Find the Title that you want to rip from the drop down menu (screenshot). Your DVD might have more than one Title so make sure you select the one that is the longest. The example below has a video that is 5 minutes and 29 seconds long. Note, if your video was shot using "Chapters," then you will see a list of Chapters in the drop-down. This example only has one Title and one Chapter.



STEP 3:

Select the Destination of where you want to save the video. Make sure you remember where you saved it so it is easy to find once you start to upload to Go Big.


In addition, you want to save it in an MP4 file format and select “Web optimized” as indicated in the screen shot below.

STEP 4:

In the Video section, the screen shot below are the settings you should select. These fields should appear as the default, but if not, please change them. In addition, make sure you set the **Average bitrate to 600 kbps**. This will ensure the proper encoding for the web.



You should leave all the other settings (Audio & Subtitles, Chapters and Advance) in the default position.

STEP 5:

In the Audio section, you will see a “Picture Settings” button. Click this button so that you can make adjustments to the pictures.

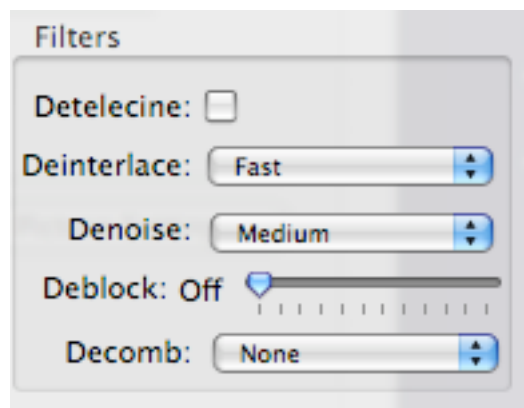

After you click “Picture Settings,” you will see the following screenshot:



In the bottom right corner, under Filters, you should set the Deinterlace to “**Fast**” and Denoise to “**Medium**” (the screenshot below illustrates this). Once you make your selections, click the “Close” button.



STEP 7:

Finally, into the header of Handbrake, click the green “Start” button.

This process will take between 10-30 minutes, depending on how big the original DVD format is of your game film.

Once the ripping is complete, you are now ready to upload your file to Go Big Recruiting. Also, please note that due to the size of these game film video files, uploading could take anywhere between 30min and 2 hours, depending on the speed of your internet connection.
